(NO CHARGE FOR ENTRY TO THE COMPETITIVE CLASSES)

Amateur Classes, are open to those who do not earn a living from horticulture or open their gardens to the public

Junior classes, are open to all those under the age of 16, unless otherwise stated

## THE SHOW RULES

1. No exhibit to be removed before 3.30pm on Saturday 7th March 2026 Any Exhibits that exhibitors wish to collect need to be removed by 4.30pm on Saturday 7th March 2026.
2. Sudden Oak Death - please note that in order to prevent the spread of this disease all cut woody exhibits in the competitive classes will be disposed of by the Committee at end of the show.
3. Plant material should be free from blemishes and disease and of good overall quality. Any exhibit showing signs of pests or disease will be removed by the stewards and disqualified.
4. Amateur classes are open to any exhibitor who does not earn an income from horticulture or open their garden to the public
5. The organisers will not be responsible for any exhibit not claimed by 4.30pm on Saturday 8th March 2025.
6. Exhibits must have been in the possession of the exhibitors for a period of not less than 3 months prior to the show. Exceptions are made for Floral Art and Floristry.
7. The organisers will take every reasonable care of the exhibits but will not accept any responsibility for loss or damage.
8. All vases will be loaned to the exhibitors by the organisers. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure their plant material is watered. Water will be made available.
9. Any objections to decisions taken by the judges must be submitted to the show secretary by the exhibitor, in writing, no later than 3pm on Friday 6th March 2026. The decision reached by the Show Committee will be final and binding.
10. The use of Oasis/floral foam is not permitted in the staging of any arrangement.

## SECTION 2 CAMELLIAS

### SPECIMEN BLOOM CLASSES

*Specimen blooms should have one and not more than 3 leaves left on their stems, all buds to be removed. Moss may be used but must not extend beyond the vase rim.*

*Entries must not exceed 15x15cm(6x6in)*

For the purposes of this Show, Camellia flowers are classified into six groups conforming to the following definitions:-



#### **SINGLE -**

Not more than 9 petals,  
with central boss of  
stamens



#### **SEMI-DOUBLE**

2 or more rows of petals,  
stamens conspicuous.



#### **ANEMONE-FORM**

Flat with one or more rows  
of large outer petals  
and a central convex  
mass of twisted  
petaloids & stamens.



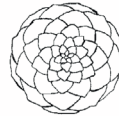
#### **PAEONY-FORM**

Deep & rounded, with  
several rows of outer  
petals and a central  
convex mass of  
twisted petaloids



#### **ROSE-FORM**

Several rows of petals,  
showing stamens  
overlapping in a concave  
when fully open



#### **FORMAL-DOUBLE**

Many rows of fully neatly  
overlapping petals  
obscuring the central  
stamens.

All exhibitors will be issued with a ticket for free admission to the Show which can be used by the exhibitor only on one of the show days.





## SECTION 3 DAFFODILS



### DIVISION 1

#### *Trumpet Daffodil Cultivars*

One flower to a stem; corona (trumpet) as long as, or longer than the perianth segments (petals)



### DIVISION 2

#### *Large-cupped Daffodil Cultivars*

One flower to a stem; corona more one-third, but less than equal to the length of the perianth



### DIVISION 3

#### *Small-cupped Daffodil Cultivars*

One flower to a stem; corona not more than one third in length of the perianth segments



### DIVISION 4

#### *Double Daffodil Cultivars*

One or more flowers to a stem, with doubling of the perianth segments or the corona or both



### DIVISION 5

#### *Triandrus Daffodil Cultivars*

Characteristics of *N. Triandrus* clearly evident: usually two or more pendant flowers to a stem; perianth segments reflexed.



### DIVISION 6

#### *Cyclamineus Daffodil Cultivars*

Characteristics of *N. cyclamineus* clearly evident: one flower to a stem; perianth segments significantly reflexed; flower at acute angle to stem, with very short pedicel (neck).



### DIVISION 7

#### *Jonquerilla and Apodanthus Daffodil Cultivars*

Characteristics of Sections Jonquilla or Apodanthi clearly evident: one to five (rarely eight) flowers to a stem; perianth segments spreading or reflexed; corona cup-shaped, funnel-shaped or flared, usually wider than long; flowers usually fragrant.



### DIVISION 8

#### *Tazetta Daffodil Cultivars*

Characteristics of section Tazetta clearly evident; usually three to twenty flowers to a stout stem; perianth segments spreading not relaxed; flowers usually fragrant.



### DIVISION 9

#### *Poeticus Daffodil Cultivars*

Characteristics of the *N. poeicus* group: usually one flower to a stem; perianth segments pure white; corona very short or disc-shaped, usually with green and/or yellow centre and a red rim, but sometimes of a single colour; flowers usually fragrant.



### DIVISION 10

#### *Bulbocodium Daffodil Cultivars*

Characteristics of section bulbocodium clearly evident; usually on flower to a stem; perianth segments insignificant compared with the dominant corona; anthers dorsiflexed (i.e attached more or less centrally to the filament and style usually curved)



### DIVISION 11

#### *Split Corona Daffodil Cultivars*

Corona split- usually for more than half it's length

a) Collar Daffodil split-corona daffodils with the corona segments opposite the perianth segments; the corona segments usually in two whirls of three.



b) Papilion Daffodil Split-corona daffodils with the corona segments alternate to the perianth segments usually in a single whorl of six.

Those not fitting the definitions of any other division e.g. Tete-a-Tete
